To add some additional clarity to the whole Kali Yuga vs the Vedic Goddess Kali, since I've seen this come up before, the actual proper syntax for the Goddess in Latinization is closer to Kālī, whereas the Kali Yuga Kali is simply Kali. Kali (Asura) and Kālī (Goddess) are two distinct figures. Kali the Asura, as Cobra says, is simply a personification of the concept of Adharma, that which is not in accord with Dharma. So, literally, the age of Adharma, when the least amount of people follow Dharma. Kali, in the context of Hinduism, is described as an Asura, as noted above. This is in contrast with the Deva, who are the traditional Vedic Gods, Kālī included. Before anyone gets any LARP ideas in mind like some of the weird pretender movements out there, this doesn't mean that the Jews are Asuras or whatever. Asuras occupy the same occult concept as Giants/Titans in Greek theology, and Jotunn in Norse, just as some examples. These forces represent the base, naturally inclined material aspects of existence, oftentimes versus the ascendant spiritual aspects of the Olympians/Aesir/Devas. There are, of course, other terms to refer to the "Kali Yuga".

Some Greek philosophers referred to this as the Iron Age, specifically due to its association with the heavier base metals, as opposed to the loftier Golden Age. Bit of a gross oversimplification, of course, but people should get the idea. Another thing to mention is, the Kali Yuga stands separate to the Astrological Age. I've seen people make the mistake of "Piscean Age - Kali Yuga/Aquarian Age - Satya Yuga" before, and it's not exactly that simple. Not to say that the two are totally unrelated, but it's not as simple as one being one and one being the other.

The Yuga's appear to be named after what one should actually seek in a Yuga, not as descriptive names of what the Yuga is. For example, during Satya-Yuga, we must seek Satya, as we do ourselves.

This will lead to empowerment, growth, and massive evolution. Currently, we say that we live in the so called "Kali Yuga", which is an age of general downfall.
